#### Preparing plants For the Frenzy

Lorraine encourages all those members who intend to sell at the Frenzy that they need to begin preparations now. Plants take 6 to 8 weeks to form roots. Now is the time to pot them. If selling pups leave them on the mother plant and cut them off in Spring.

Michael again entertained us with his Alcantarea plants. He showed us an unnamed species grown from seed in 2009. Quite rare with less than a dozen plants in Australia. He explained the meanings of species, cultivar, hybrid and grex\*. The Werauhia was also a new sight for some of our members.



Peter entertained the members with an interesting and humorous account of his garden and his developing interest in bromeliads and the collective bug. This love resulted in the selling of his suburban home and the buying of acreage to house his growing collection. The presentation also showed the front garden of the new house where Denise was able to demonstrate her fabulous ability to landscape. Last house she had done the same thing but Peter managed to overcrowd the area and reduce the effect!

There was a field day at Denis and Peter's house on the Sunday and there were lots of members there. It was great to see the progress of the landscaping.

Peter also brought in an *Ursulaea macvaughii* for the members to admire the inflorescence. It was a particularly brave thing to do because this plant can bite. It is also easy to remove all the lovely scurfing on the plant.

#### \*Definitions

Species: found in nature, have common characteristics and qualities

Hybrid: the offspring of two plants of different species

Cultivar: the offspring of two plants, originated and maintained in cultivation

Grex: cultivars from the same hybrid (seedlings from the 1 cross)
