## Inside Story, June Feature Plant—Alcantarea



Once again, Mick Grange provided us with an informative presentation, this time on the genus of Alcantarea.

He took us on a journey through all things Alc, starting with their natural habitat characteristics. From there we saw the range of imperialis family specimens, moving from the stunning colours of Rubra, Purpurea, Skotak, Arno, Silver Plum and Landsendt Red through to the green shades of Landsendt Blue Green and finishing with the much sought after variegate forms.

From here our journey continued through the various species, again covering the 'colours of the rainbow' from heloisae to odorata and

nahoumii.

Mick gave us some insights into the unknown with discussion around the likes of Grace Goode, Imbe and Wardell Orange then finished off with some photos of different crosses that have been done.
