Review – What worked well, what didn't go so good and what areas could be improved/changed?

One of the best ways to gain ideas/suggestions for improvements is through feedback. It is a great way to start the conversation so the Monster Sale can continue to be the best each year. Every idea is a good idea and provides a different perspective which is appreciated. At the end of the newsletter there is a form that you can bring to the meeting as well as editors' examples.

Show and Tell -Theme Species



Nigel presented an Aechmea brassicoides - features a rosette of stiff, mottled green leaves (like a hard leather) that form a hollow structure. The plant produces a bloom spike that forces it way through the center. **TAXONOMY** - Aechmea brassicoides is a fascinating and visually striking plant that offers aesthetic appeal and unique biological characteristics, making it a valuable addition to any plant collection.



Val presented a Sincoraea burle-marxii (small) she has grown it from seed since 2014. How she got the seeds is a story that only she can share. It is also known as Orthophytum burle-marxii and it is a terrestrial bromeliad native to a region of Brazil. It has strong coriaceous leaves, which are red at the base and green towards the apex. It is a perennial or lithophyte growing primarily in seasonally dry tropical biome. The species is known for its spectacular flowers and is a rewarding plant for succulent growers.



David presented a Racinaea dyeriana – it was from Les and Jan's Hutchins greenhouse that he has grown. Not all plants are created equal and **Tillandsia dyeriana** is one that is just a standout. Rare and endangered in its natural habitat it grows in the mangrove swamps of Ecuador. **Tillandsia dyeriana, now reclassified as Racinaea dyeriana**, is a spectacular epiphytic plant in the Bromeliaceae family, known for its vibrant orange to red flowers.

Bromelaid Information
Get to know your family of Bromeliaceae

Perhaps, perhaps, perhaps, you have the label but you think the name is incorrect. Perhaps, perhaps perhaps, perhaps, the label has faded and can only see bits of the name. Phone a friend OR use the reference web pages.

Dig it, you may like to find out the Origin (no not NRL) of the bromeliad. Dig it, dig it, now you would like more information such the ‘seed parent’ and the “pollan parent’ got it, dig it.

Shout if out, you may like to find out more about the description of what the bromeliad looks like. 
